The following federal, state, and local tax changes are included in this update.

# State and Local Legislative Updates

This section lists the state and local updates available with this release. If a state or locality is not listed in this section, there are currently no tax updates or product modifications for that state or locality.

### California

Effective July 1, 2015, California employers must show the number of available sick days each employee has on their pay stub or in a document issued the same day as their paycheck. Employers must also keep record of how many hours each employee earned and used for three years. This information may be stored on documents available to employees electronically.

**Tip:** You can use SAP® Crystal Reports to make the required edits to the payroll checks.

## Kentucky

- A new tax code has been added for Pulaski County for employees working in Somerset so that
  the reduced tax rate for the county will be calculated. The new code is KY0250 Pulaski (Som)
  CO Regular IT. There were no changes made to the existing code (KY0120 Pulaski CO
  Regular IT). The new tax code rates are as follows:
  - For April 1, 2015 through June 30, 2015 individuals working in Somerset are to be withheld 0.9% for Pulaski County payroll occupational tax.
  - For July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 individuals working in Somerset are to be withheld 0.8% for Pulaski County payroll occupational tax.
  - There is a state mandated offset of 0.1% for the fiscal year ending 6/30/15 and a 0.2% offset for the fiscal year ending 6/30/16 for revenue sharing. After that the offset is no longer applicable and employees working in Pulaski County will be withheld 1% regardless of whether or not they work in Somerset.

### New York

A recent legislative change to the New York City personal income tax for taxpayers with taxable income over \$500,000 has caused New York City withholding tax changes (NYCIT - New York City Regular IT). Effective for payrolls made on or after June 1, 2015, employers who elect (or are required) to use Method II, Exact Calculation Method, must use the revised exact calculation method (s) due to changes in the line 7, Column 5 amounts in each of the tables.

After installing the Q2, 2015 tax update and after processing your last payroll for this quarter, you can inactivate the Waynesville VI Regular IT tax by following these steps:

 Select the **Inactive** check box to inactivate the local tax code (Setup > Payroll > Local and Other Custom Taxes) and to prevent it from being added to employees. 2. Remove the local tax (OH0820) from each employee record (Payroll > Employees > Tax tab).

**Note:** If the local tax is not removed from the employees, it will continue to calculate when you process payroll.

# Sage Payroll Tax Forms and eFiling by Aatrix

Sage Payroll Tax Forms and eFiling by Aatrix is a feature included with Sage 300 ERP 2012. This functionality provides updated reports and forms at no cost and enables you to fill out and file tax forms electronically for a small fee.

To begin using tax forms with Sage Payroll Tax Forms and eFiling by Aatrix, open one of the tax forms available in **Federal Tax Filing** or **State Tax Filing** from **Payroll** > **Government Reports** after installing this update. You will be prompted to register your organization with Sage Payroll Tax Forms and eFiling by Aatrix. After registering, you have the option to enroll your company (or companies) in the eFiling service.

# Quarterly Wage on Disk(ette)

If you use Sage 300 ERP 2012 U.S. Payroll, you can use the Quarterly Wage on Disk(ette) feature to produce the following quarterly wage reports:

• State Unemployment Tax (SUTA) quarterly wage reports on diskette or hard disk (for states or regions not supported by Sage Payroll Tax Forms and eFiling by Aatrix).

**Note:** As of tax year 2006, the Social Security Administration (SSA) no longer accepts W-2s on physical media (such as diskettes or CD), although some states still do. For more details about the submission methods that are acceptable for W-2 reporting and submission deadlines, consult your tax authorities.

# **Product Update Installation Instructions**

Follow the instructions in this section to install, apply, and verify this Product Update.

### Before you start:

- · Back up your data.
- Make sure all users have exited the program.
- Download the Product Update from the Sage Customer Portal.
- Verify your service pack or product update level. To verify what service pack or product update you have installed, click the **System Information** option on the **Help** menu in Sage 300 ERP.

## Installing the Product Update

### To install the Product Update:

- 1. Right-click the Product Update file to Run as Administrator (or make sure you have administrator rights to run the installation) and launch the installation program.
- 2. On the Welcome window, click **Next** to continue to the Software License Agreement window.
- 3. Select the features to install. Click **Next**, then **Install**.
- 4. On the Setup Complete window, click **Finish** to finish the installation.

# Activating the Tax Update

#### To activate the Tax Update:

- 1. Start Sage 300 ERP.
- 2. In the Administrative Services folder, select Data Activation.
- 3. Select the current tax update, and then click **Activate**.
- 4. If you are prompted to convert a previous payroll tax update to the current version, click **Proceed**.

After you complete installation and activation, and after you have made any adjustments described in this document, you can resume processing payroll.

## Verifying the Product Update

After the update is complete, you can confirm that the update was installed successfully by selecting **Help > System Information**.

**Note:** After installing this update, under **System Information** in Sage 300 ERP, the tax update version will be listed with a product update number. This has no impact on the content delivered with the tax and product update.

## Updating the Local Tax Repository and Rates

This section applies only if you use local tax codes in U.S. Payroll.

### To update the local tax repository and rates:

- 1. After the Product Update is complete, log in to Sage 300 ERP.
- 2. On the Local and Other Custom Taxes window, click the **Install Repository** button to update all of the local tax rates in the system.
- 3. After the repository update finishes, click the Finder button and select each of your local tax codes individually. For each local tax code, click the **Update** button to update the company level tax rates with the information from the repository.

**Important!** If any of your local tax codes use the Percentage of Base calculation method, you must update each employee assigned that tax code to ensure that the rate at the employee level is correct.
