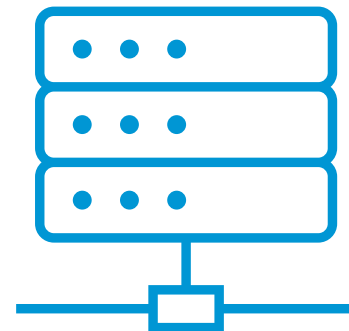

Should Security Be a Priority?

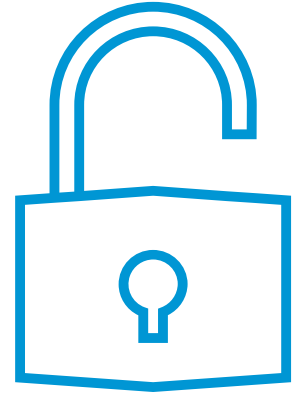
- Increased rates of attacks

High Tech / Low Tech

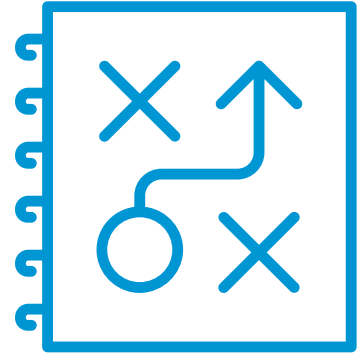
- Phishing / "Social Engineering"

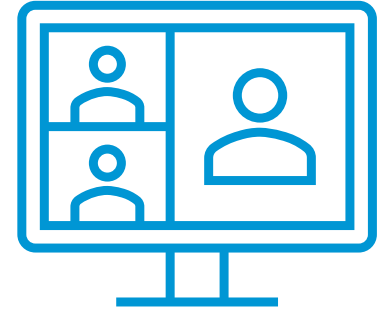

Departmental / Role

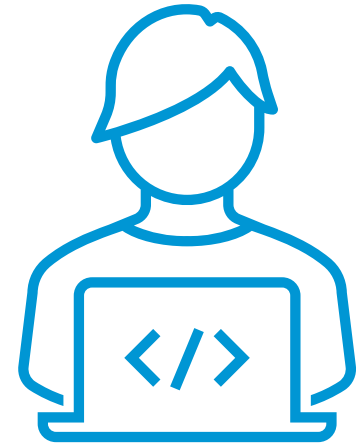
- Alignment with enterprise priorities

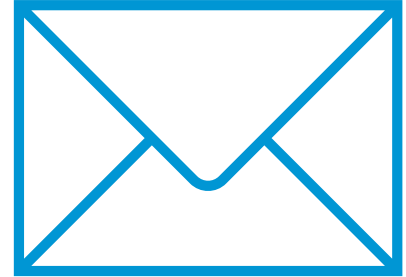
- Additional Password Complexity

- Mitigations



Specific Risks

Check Washing

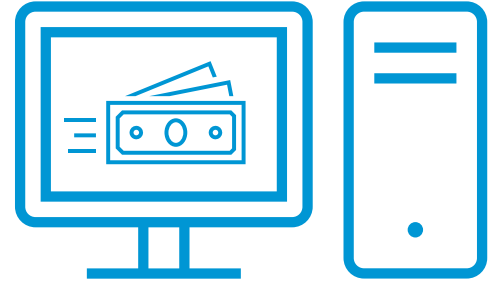
- Increasingly Common
- Mitigations:
 - Secure digital / EFT connections
 - Positive-Pay



Specific Risks

EFT Misdirection

- Changing account data for a vendor
- Impersonation of Executives
- Mitigations
